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

# Brown County Historical Society awarded grant to inventory part of its artifact collection

The Brown County Historical Society (BCHS) in New Ulm was awarded a Minnesota historical and cultural heritage grant for \$8,982 to inventory and catalog part of the society's textile and artifact collection housed in the Brown County Museum's artifact storage spaces. The objects include textiles, household furnishings, sculptures, and paintings. This project is the second phase of a five-year comprehensive inventory of the 16,000 artifacts in BCHS' artifact collection.

The inventory will be completed by two part-time contractors. The contractors will enter information on each artifact into the society's electronic collections database before photographing and repacking the artifacts into their storage boxes. Anyone interested in applying for the contract positions can see the job description below, or may contacting the BCHS Collections Curator Ryan Harren at 507-233-2624 for more information.

This project was made possible in part by the people of Minnesota through a grant funded by an appropriation to the Minnesota Historical Society from the Minnesota Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund.

## BCHS now hiring two contract positions to complete inventory

The Brown County Historical Society seeks two part-time, temporary contract collections assistants to inventory a portion of the artifacts in the care of the Brown County Historical Society as part of a phased inventory of its entire 3D artifact collection. The project will include textiles, small sculptures, paintings, and miscellaneous household or business artifacts. The work will include reviewing and updating current catalog records to include descriptions, measurements, history, condition, and photographs into the museum's PastPerfect database. Appropriate marking and photographing of objects is also needed before placing them back into storage. The collections assistants will work under the direction of the collections curator.

These are positions are grant-funded in part with funds provided by the State of Minnesota from the Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund through the Minnesota Historical Society.

Pay is \$15 per hour, with a minimum of 20 hours per week expected.

#### **Duties and Responsibilities:**

- Creates new catalog records if needed in the PastPerfect collections database.
- Reviews and updates existing catalog records and inputs required information on each object.
- Documents condition details of each object, and researches object histories.
- Photographs, assigns numbers as needed, and rehouses each object.

#### **Desired Qualifications:**

Degree in museum studies, history, or equivalent.

- Experience working with historical collections.
- Experience working with PastPerfect or other museum collections database.

#### **Required Qualifications:**

- Able to bend, stoop, climb ladders, or reach for and carry items up to 30 lbs.
- Able to write neatly and legibly.
- Be organized and meticulous.
- Skilled at using computers.
- Willing to perform computer data entry into PastPerfect Museum Software.
- Willing to follow established collections procedures and project work plan.
- Able to work as part of a team.

#### **FOOD SHELF UPDATE:**

The Springfield Area Food Shelf would like to keep you updated on current procedures that are happening during this COVID-19 Pandemic. Food Shelf numbers have dropped this year since COVID began in March, 2020. We want to reassure all people that we are taking every precaution necessary to provide a safe delivery of food and products during this time. Second Harvest and the CDC are providing us with direction to make volunteers and clients safe.

The food shelf hours are Tuesday 5-7 pm and Thursdays 9:30-11:30. Clients are to call in during the day on Tuesday with your name, number, and number of people in your household. Call cell phone number Jan Schwanke(507-227-7387) with this information. For Thursdays you are to call in on Wednesday during the day. Volunteers than come to the food shelf and will call you to take your order and set it together while going thru the food shelf to tell you what is available and get your order completed. It is very important that you are in the parking lot when you do this so you are available to get the order loaded into your vehicle CURBSIDE PICK-UP.

If you prefer not to do your grocery order based on what is available then volunteers can put a box or bags together, of the basic food groups. If you only need certain things such as meat, produce and dairy that can be done also. You need to communicate your order to the person on the phone. Take just what you want and need. HOLIDAY BOXES WILL BE AVAILABLE IN NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER.

If transportation is difficult for you to come and get food then let us know that and we may be able to help you find someone. Call Jan Schwanke at above number.

Even though you may be getting extra funding at this time, we encourage you to still come to the food shelf and get what you need. We still have to place orders and we receive commodities such as milk, meat, ETC. If we do not get something that we have normally provided we will go to the local market and purchase products. Families of children going to school and who participate in the meal service twice a day, will qualify to come to the local food shelf and get what they need. Only information required is name, number in household, and phone number to reach you. We do not ask any financial information ever. No Forms are being signed by clients at this time due to COVID-19 pandemic.

Back-pack program is available and if you are unable to get your bag of food at your school, stop at the food shelf to pick up your food. Comfrey schools are participating at this time. Please contact Jan Schwanke with any further questions.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED on delivery day which is the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesday in the morning. Jan Schwanke will usually send a text out to volunteers when delivery truck is getting close by Springfield. Call Jan Schwanke at above number.

Volunteers are also needed for service days. Shifts are approximately 2-2 ½ hours on Tuesday night or Thursday mornings. Call Jan Schwanke at above number.

#### **Tax Break Available for Beginning Farmers**

#### Tax credit available for land, equipment expenses to start farming

St. Paul, MN: The Minnesota Department of Agriculture's (MDA) Rural Finance Authority is now accepting applications for a tax credit for the sale or lease of land, equipment, machinery, and livestock in Minnesota by beginning farmers.

To qualify, the applicant must be a Minnesota resident with the desire to start farming or who began farming in Minnesota within the past ten years, provide positive projected earnings statements, have a net worth less than \$851,000, and enroll in, or have completed an approved financial management program.

The farmer cannot be directly related by blood or marriage to the person from whom he or she is buying or renting assets. The farmer must provide the majority of the labor and management of the farm.

The tax credit for the sale or lease of assets can then be applied to the Minnesota income taxes of the owner of the agricultural land or other assets.

Three levels of credits are available:

• 5% of the lesser of the sale price or fair market value of the agricultural asset up to a maximum of \$32,000

- 10% of the gross rental income of each of the first, second and third years of a rental agreement, up to a maximum of \$7,000 per year
- 15% of the cash equivalent of the gross rental income in each of the first, second or third year of a share rent agreement, up to a maximum of \$10,000 per year

The <u>Beginning Farmer Tax Credit</u> is available on a first-come, first-served basis. Applications must be received by October 1, 2021.

Interested farmers should note that they can also apply for a separate tax credit to offset the cost of a financial management program up to a maximum of \$1,500 per year – for up to three years.



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

### **SAVE FOR FUTURE REFERENCE**

City of Springfield Snow Removal Information



Springfield residents expect high-quality snow plowing that clears streets so that emergency vehicles and drivers like you can travel safely and park easily.

Snow removal is based on priorities and crews address the next task as able once prior tasks are complete. Please refrain from parking on Emergency Snow Routes until cleared curb to curb. This will be completed by 7am unless snowing continues.

Priority 1 = Emergency Snow Routes

Priority 2 = Schools & Business Districts

Priority 3 = Residential Streets

Priority 4 = Alleys (Subject to Roadway Conditions)

It is a misdemeanor for any person to remove snow from a residential driveway or boulevard sidewalk and place it on a public street. Boulevard sidewalks must be cleared within 24 hours after an accumulating snowfall event.

Vehicles must also be moved within 24 hours of a the accumulating snowfall event so that crews are able to finish clearing areas where previously parked.
