



Please read the eligibility requirements carefully to see if you may qualify for assistance.

Eligibility & Requirements

To be eligible, an applicant must meet all of the following:

- Reside in Brown County. Photo ID may be requested.
- One adult member of the application household must have been employed in an industry that
 have been impacted by MN Executive Order 20-99. Bar, restaurant, spa, pool, theater, gym,
 lodging, event or convention center, or any other service or public accommodation.
- Applicant must be without resources to meet the emergency need due to COVID-19. For example, proof of being laid off or hours reduced due to the MN Executive order 20-99 or COVID-19 illness.
- Applicant must provide a written eviction notice, overdue rental, mortgage, daycare, utility, heating fuel, or other notice of past due water/sewer bill payment.
- Once completed all monies approved will be vendor paid when possible. In some instances, the committee has the discretion to pay funds directly to the applicant.

Application Process

To be eligible, an applicant must meet all of the following:

- 1. Completed COVID-19 application
- Proof of residence in Brown County Minnesota
- Proof of emergency need (overdue bill or other notice)
- Applications will be reviewed each Friday following the opening of applications on December 21st, with committee approving applications by the following Monday and checks issued by the following Wednesday.

City of Springfield Snow Removal Information



Springfield residents expect high-quality snow plowing that clears streets so that emergency vehicles and drivers like you can travel safely and park easily.

Snow removal is based on priorities and crews address the next task as able once prior tasks are complete. Please refrain from parking on Emergency Snow Routes until cleared curb to curb. This will be completed by 7am unless snowing continues.

Priority 1 = Emergency Snow Routes

Priority 2 = Schools & Business Districts

Priority 3 = Residential Streets

Priority 4 = Alleys (Subject to Roadway Conditions)

It is a misdemeanor for any person to remove snow from a residential driveway or boulevard sidewalk and place it on a public street. Boulevard sidewalks must be cleared within 24 hours after an accumulating snowfall event.

Vehicles must also be moved within 24 hours of a the accumulating snowfall event so that crews are able to finish clearing areas where previously parked.
