Eligible applicants must be an incorporated 501(c)3 not-for-profit charitable organization, unit of government, or educational organization. Religious and unincorporated organizations may apply if they have a fiscal host. Applicants must provide services based on need, be non-discriminatory, be governed by an active policy making board, have a sound financial budget for their proposed program or project, and have a local chapter or program that serves residents in Brown County.

New and established organizations/program that are addressing a local or unique need that is not currently being met in Brown County are encouraged to apply. The United Way Board of directors and staff believe that by elevating and aiding the most in need in our service area, we can make every person's life better in Brown County.




