# **Parks & Recreation**

**Riverside Park** - Riverside Park is nestled along the Big Cottonwood River. It features an outdoor swimming pool with a figure-8 water slide and kiddy pool. It also offers tennis courts, baseball and softball fields, sand volleyball, horseshoe, and two playground areas.

**Trails** - Enjoy a 5.0 mile paved hiking/biking path around Riverside park and along the river to the Springfield Golf Course.

**Rothenburg Campground** - Adjacent to the park is Rothenburg Campground, which has 47 electrical/water hook up sites, tenting area, 2 bathhouses with showers and a disposal station. Reservations available and recommended. Camping fee is payable in advance. Phone: 507-723-3517

Browns Park – A solid block in the southwest residential section of Springfield. A favorite place for family picnics and small gatherings. Basketball court, playground equipment, beautiful place to gather.

Sticker Field – Newly renovated consisting of two softball fields, green space and concession stand with restrooms.

East End Park – This little park, located along U.S. Highway 14, on the east end of town, is a convenient rest area for travelers. There is playground equipment, rest rooms, a shelter and barbecue grills. Electric Vehicle Charing Station. East End Park displays an Avenue of Flags on all patriotic holidays.

**North Park** – Located on Maple Street just west of the Medical Clinic. This small park has a variety of playground equipment and picnic tables.

Martha Anderson Veterans Memorial Park – Established in 1911 as the first city park, situated in the heart of the downtown area. Monuments honoring our area veterans and servicemen are located in the park.


